FROM THE DIRECTOR

Good evening and welcome to the Village Players' production of Fiddler On The Roof. It is a truly heartfelt honor for me to again direct this much-loved musical here in our own community theater.

Life is a circle. When I directed Fiddler for the first time in 1988, I was fresh out of college, and as a young woman identified closely with "The Daughters" of Anatevka. In the 25 years since that production, I too fell in love, married, raised a child, buried my parents - lived a life. I have a deeper appreciation for the work that goes into creating and maintaining the strong bonds of family and community. As you can imagine, I now find myself identifying more closely with "The Mamas" of the village. This autumn, as one of my own life's circles, I have returned to a village I left 25 years ago-the village of Anatevka, realizing my dream to once again direct this wonderful production from a changed perspective. The village has welcomed me home with open arms...a more heartwarming homecoming I had never imagined.

The Village Players organization, too, has matured in the last 25 years. We've purchased this building; we've evolved into a more professionally run theater. Much of that was due to the efforts of Michael Wilkes, who gave a memorable performance as Tevye in our 1988 production. Michael unexpectedly passed away earlier this year, a heartbreak to all in our Players' "village". This show is dedicated to him.

When I thought about what to include in the program, I started by reviewing the "Letter from the Director" that I wrote 25 years ago. After reading it, it became apparent yet again why Fiddler is such a timeless classic: It's the age-old story of tradition and changes, of family struggles and love. So I decided that my letter from 1988 can stand on its own. Here, then, are my thoughts from a quarter century ago:

Tonight you will meet Tevye and you will come to understand his struggle to balance his love for his family, his community and his God. You may recognize the conflicts that Tevye faces both as a man and as a parent, for many of the issues are still relevant today.

You will meet Tevye's wife Golde, whose brusque manner is little more than a shield used to protect her feelings of love and her motherly concern for her daughters' happiness. And you will meet their daughters: Tzeitel, whose love for Motel the tailor changes him from a nervous youth to a mature man, a husband and father much like her own; Hodel whose values and beliefs are challenged when she meets Perchik the student; and Chava, "everybody's favorite child" whose love for Fyedka proves stronger than her faith.

Fiddler On The Roof is their story, played out by loveable characters and filled with memorable songs, all part of a tradition which leads one generation into the next in a circle. You will discover why it has endured as one of the best-loved musicals of all time.

It's said that it "takes a village." This undertaking would not have been possible (nor as much fun) without the support of so many people that it will be impossible to thank them all here. But Diane, Keith, Kaylin and Cate: You are amazing. Thank you for your faith in me. I could not have done it without you. And to Scott: You are my world.


