## DRINKING HABITS by Tom Smith

### *Drinking Habits* cast off and running

The new year at the Village Players Theater began with auditions for the spring show, with a number of actors turning out looking to earn a spot in *Drinking Habits* by Tom Smith.

*Drinking Habits* focuses on two nuns at the Sisters of Perpetual Sewing who have been secretly making wine in order to keep the convent open. Two undercover reporters, who also happen to have been formerly engaged to each other, set out in an undercover mission as a nun and a priest to figure out what's going on in the convent. Additionally, the arrival of a new nun has rumors flying in the convent that spies have been sent from Rome to shut it down.

Longtime Village Player, Megan Rohrbacher, steps to the forefront as the director for this farce and she will be joined by first-time assistant director, Paul Stewart, who has graced the Village Players stage in numerous roles, including the starring role as Horton the Elephant in *Seussical* and was most recently Prince Herbert in *Monty Python's Spamalot*.

With auditions in the books, a cast that will be familiar to most Village Players audience members will be taking the stage. Two of the sisters have been working overtime to make and sell the wine to keep their convent open; Sister Augusta, played by Emily Marsh, who has been in numerous Village Players productions over the years, including a starring role as Miss Casewell in last spring's production of *The Mousetrap*, and Sister Philomena, played by Kristi Nieman, who is probably best-known in Village Players circles for her stellar turn in the title role in *Mame* in 2009.

Father Chenille, the local pastor, will also be portrayed by a Village Players veteran, as Brooks Campbell will step into the role. Campbell had a starring role as Major Metcalf in last spring's production of *The Mousetrap*. Helen Rautenberg, another Village Players veteran who was most recently on stage in *The Mousetrap* as Mrs. Boyle, will be playing Mother Superior in this spring's production. The role of George, the groundskeeper at the convent, will be played by Vinny Amico, who will be familiar to many Village Players attendees for his roles in many recent productions, including Not Dead Fred and Robin's Minstrel in *Monty Python's Spamalot*.

The new sister on the block who raises suspicions amongst the convent's residents, Sister Mary Catherine, will be portrayed by Maggie Fraser, who was seen as part of the chorus in the fall production of *Spamalot*. In the roles of Sally and Paul, the two reporters charged with figuring out just what's going on in the convent, Rohrbacher has cast Jennifer Smith and Rick Tessari. Smith made her Village Players debut in last summer's *Boeing-Boeing* and also served as assistant director for *Spamalot* during the fall. Tessari has been on stage in numerous productions, including starring roles in *Leading Ladies* and *Boeing-Boeing*. He was most recently on stage as The Black Knight in *Spamalot*.

A number of backstage roles have been set, with Matthew Johnson running the lights and sound and Kaylin Dean serving as stage manager. Bob Rautenberg will be leading the hunt for props, while Russ Ellis and Eric Milligan will be supervising the building and decorating of the set. Bobbi Boudman will be designing the costumes and Joshua Spaulding will be serving as the show's producer.

*Drinking Habits* is presented by special arrangements with Playscripts, Inc. The show will open on Friday, April 1, and will hit the stage again on Saturday, April 2, Friday, April 8, and Saturday, April 9, all at 8 p.m. and Sunday, April 10, at 2 p.m. Tickets will be available in early March at [village-players.com](http://village-players.com) or at Black's Paper and Gifts in Wolfeboro.

Welcome back! Rosemary initially joined the VP in the spring of 1987. She soon joined the board as Secretary, and later President in the early 1990s. Stage Manager, Assistant Director, and Director were her only roles until summer, 1999 when she appeared on stage

during one of the performances in a non-speaking role as "The Nurse" in *She Loves Me*. The other on-stage role she has performed was as one of the nuns in the 2005 (Michael Wilkes'-directed) *Sound of Music*. "Bloom Where You Are Planted" is one of her maxims, and she greatly prefers an off-stage role! In 2013, Rosemary returned to the theater directing the 25th anniversary production of *Fiddler on the Roof*. By day she works as a local banker; her extra-curricular activities (aside from VP) include singing in the a cappella vocal ensemble, "Some Friends" and also enjoying her favorite role is that of wife to Scott and mom to Matthew, currently a senior at Colby College in Maine.

"Philadelphia Story" is on tap for Saturday, February 27th at 8pm and Sunday, February 28th at 2pm. Katherine Hepburn plays a snooty Philadelphia socialite who learns a great deal about herself when her ex-husband, played by Cary Grant and a friend of her brother, played by James Stewart, show up the day before her second wedding. These terrific actors brought this romantic comedy to the level of the classic movies. Katherine Hepburn was nominated for an Oscar and won The New York Film Critics Award for Best Actress. James Stewart won the Oscar for Best Actor in a Leading Role.

In March, we will be presenting the Alfred Hitchcock thriller, "Rear Window." Another vehicle for showing the talents of James Stewart, who plays the wheel-chair bound apartment dweller who uses binoculars to spy on his neighbors. His girlfriend, played by Grace Kelly, helps him investigate the strange things he sees through his window in the apartment of his sinister-looking neighbor, played by Raymond Burr. appear to be between 20 and 30. He carries the show for most of the time and appears in nearly every scene. This is a plum role for the right person. He sings "If I Loved You," "Blow High, Blow Low," the famous "Soliloquy," and "The Highest Judge of All." His voice range must be from A2 (the bottom space in the F clef score) to G4 (the highest space in the F clef score). These are the words that describe him: rogue, impulsive, passionate, lonely, rough, hapless, volatile, swagger, sympathetic, charming, ladies' man, strapping, handsome, manly, remorseful, brash, tough, aggressive, sensitive.

Julie Jordon co-stars with Billy. She must have an operatic type soprano voice and be a strong actress. She must appear to be between 17 and 25. Her voice range must be between C4 (middle C) and G6 (the line above the staff in the G clef). She sings "If I Loved You," "What's The Use of Wondrin'," "You're a Queer One, Julie Jordan," and songs with the chorus. These are the words that describe her: passionate, loyal, longing, shy, dreamer, quiet strength, loner, restless, sensitive, obstinate.

Carol Bense will be directing with Rosemary Lounsbury as assistant director.
