Susie Monohan, BSN, RN - 28 years old, Dr. Bearing's primary nurse

E. M. Ashford, PhD - 80 years old, professor emerita of English literature, Vivian's former college professor Mr. Bearing - Vivian's father, 70-80 years old Assorted lab technicians and students

we appreciate their applause.






